

A group of Gideons, known for putting Bibles in motel rooms, once shared a story with me. In the heart of the Midwest, a group of Gideons were giving away pocket Bibles to hardworking individuals on their way to work the morning shift. It so happened that on one side of the worksite was a factory employing a large part of the town, while by the factory's walkway sat a construction site to repair an old building.

One day, two events happened simultaneously. A Gideon gave David, a young man with a new wife and baby, a pocket Bible while David was hurrying to the construction site. He was irritated at being bothered while trying to clock in on time, but he accepted it and put it in his pocket.

A few moments later, Mark looked at the new pocket Bible in his hand and the man who gave it to him. Mark, recently divorced from an unfaithful wife, had recently questioned his relationship with God. He felt he needed a sign from God to restart his spiritual journey. Mark slowly started walking towards the factory's entrance where he worked, thinking about his recent troubles..

Meanwhile, David, who had been there a few minutes earlier, had decided that the Bible was in his way and didn't need it. He was working on a rooftop and didn't want anything bulging from his pants pocket, so he took the pocket Bible and threw it off the roof without aiming it anywhere in particular.

However, all was not lost. The small book flew through the air and hit Mark right in the back of his head. Mark took it as a sign that he needed to read his new Bible. There was nothing subtle about that sign.

Word got around about Mark's subsequent conversion, and the news that his Bible brought a man to Christ got back to David. David also needed a sign, and that Bible seemed to him to be a clear one.
